# Water & Sewer Rates

At the March 14, 2019 regular Board of Directors Meeting, the Board also considered, and approved, a motion to keep the base water and sewer rates unchanged from the

last two fiscal years. As a reminder, the base rate for a 3/4" x 5/8" water meter will remain at \$36.00 per month, a 1" water meter will remain at \$90.00 and a 2" water meter will remain at \$288.00. All base rates are for service only and do not include any water used. The District bills in 1,000 gallon increments and, as a reminder, the cost for water used is as indicated in the adjoining table:

purchase and installation of new Kamstrup water meters; \$10,000 for future water line replacement and \$3,000 earmarked for future repairs to Well #3's pump and motor. Waste water system capital improvements included setting aside \$5,000 for the future rebuild of lift station pumps.

The District's Bond Capital Improvements Budget was approved at \$515,000 and includes \$340,000 designated for the replacement of two or three critical sewer system collection lines and \$175,000 designated for a portable generator for the lift stations. No remaining bond funds were designated for the water system, as most, if not all, of those projects have already been completed.



Sewer rates for every fiscal year (April 1st-March 31st) are calculated based on each individual customer's winter water use average, as determined by their water use during the months of December, January and February. Each residential and commercial customer is allotted 3,000 gallons per month in accordance with the Waste Water Treatment Contract the District holds with the City of La Grange, who is responsible for the treatment of the District's waste water. All residential customers whose winter water use average is 3,000 gallons or less will be charged the sewer base rate of \$35.45 and all commercial customers whose winter water use average is 3,000 gallons or less will be charged the sewer base rate of \$36.96. Any residential or commercial customer whose winter water use average exceeds 3,000 gallons per month will be charged their appropriate base rate plus an additional \$5.50 per 1,000 gallons of water consumed, as determined during the winter water use averaging period. This higher amount then becomes their fixed monthly sewer rate for the next twelve months.

The maximum contaminant level (MCL) for total trihalomethanes (TTHM) is 80 mg/L. All of our samples have been well below the MCL since Water Well #4 was put into operation in early July 2018., however, our locational running annual average (LRAA) exceeded the 80 mg/L during 3Q2018 due to the elevated sample results obtained in 2Q2018. We expect the results we received the last two quarters to continue forward.
